

Token Economy Checklist

Adherence:

	<u>Decide</u> between a reward system (i.e., students earn tokens for demonstrating positive behaviors) or a response-cost system (i.e., students earn tokens for positive behaviors and lose tokens for behaviors that are inconsistent with expectations)
	Identify target behaviors
	Decide how to measure target behaviors
	Set an <u>initial goal</u> for each behavior
	Choose a currency
	Introduce the system to the student and collaboratively develop a reward list
	<u>Develop</u> the economy/exchange rates
Imple	ementation
	Begin <u>implementing</u> the Token Economy (Remind the student of their goals and how they will earn rewards)
	<u>Respond</u> appropriately to desired behaviors. (e.g., provide specific labeled praise and connect the token to the behavior, when the student demonstrates non-desired behavior, label it and remind them of their goal)
	Meet with the student at predetermined times to review their progress toward a reward.
	Use Beacon progress monitoring tools to evaluate the extent to which this intervention is improving the target behaviors as intended
	<u>Modify</u> the intervention based on the student's progress (e.g., as the student's behavior improves the requirements for earning a token can be increased)
Quality:	more decay
	<u>Positive Student-Teacher relationships</u> increases the effectiveness of many interventions
	Provide feedback in a supportive way; use subtle, less public corrections to preserve student dignity
Tips For Suc	•
	Start off with just a few behaviors and build and adjust as you go.
	If your student does not seem motivated to earn the rewards, change them.
	Younger students may need pictures and visual reminders about their target behaviors.
	If parents are willing and able, they can participate in the token economy by providing additional reinforcement in the home environment. (see Caregiver handout)
